The thirty special agents in the Office of Inspector General, Office of Investigations, U.S. Department of State, report to Assistant Inspector General for Investigations Robert S. Terjesen and Deputy Assistant Inspector General for Investigations William N. Crane. This office conducts its investigations of State Department employees and contractors on a global scale, since all U.S.

embassies and consulates and State Department facilities in the U.S. fall under its jurisdiction.

The Office of Investigations is divided into two divisions, each headed by a Division Director. The divisions are comprised of three branches, each with a Branch Chief. Each branch has a specific geographical responsibility area to which the agents travel to conduct investi-

gations (Africa, Middle East, and Asia, Europe, South America, Eastern Asia, and the Pacific). There is also a Special Investigations Branch.
