Ms. Metzger joined the Transportation Security Administration, Office of Law Enforcement/Federal Air Marshal Service (TSA OLE/FAMS) in May 2002 and is currently the Supervisory Air Marshal in Charge (SAC) of the Law Enforcement Information Coordination Section. As the SAC, Ms. Metzger oversees the daily operations within the Counterterrorism Unit and the Analysis Intelligence Unit, which encompasses the Special Mission Coverage and Transportation Information Sharing System Programs, participates in the Administrator's Daily Intelligence Brief, and collaborates with other TSA and FAMS components and law enforcement stakeholders to ensure furtherance of its shared mission. Prior to her reassignment as SAC, Ms. Metzger was promoted to ASAC of the LE ICS Counterterrorism Unit, where she supervised seven Supervisory Federal Air Marshals assigned to the FBI-International Terrorism Operations Section, FBI-National Joint Terrorism Task Force, FBI-Domestic Terrorism Operations Unit, FBI-Criminal Investigations Division, FBI-Terrorist Screening Center, and CBP-National Targeting Center.



Ms. Metzger also served as an ASAC in the OLE/FAMS Transportation Security Operations Center (TSOC). As a TSOC ASAC, Ms. Metzger led TSOC law enforcement efforts on behalf of the TSA, regulated courses of action based on TSA strategy and FAMS CONOPS, determined an incident's investigative merit, and collaborated with TSA counterparts in seeking favorable resolutions to incidents.

Before her reassignment to TSOC ASAC, Ms. Metzger was a Supervisory Federal Air Marshal in the Orlando Field Office. As a squad supervisor, Ms. Metzger oversaw a staff of 21 Federal Air Marshals and served collateral details as the Field Intelligence Representative, Critical Incident Response Team Program Manager, and Field Emergency Response Coordinator. Ms. Metzger was also a member of the FAMS Women's Recruitment and Retention Integrated Project Team where she helped to develop procedures ensuring a fair and inclusive workplace for all employees.

Prior to promoting to SFAM, Ms. Metzger worked as a FAM within the FAMS Investigations Division, in both the Counterterrorism Branch and Transportation Investigations Branch, where she received the Senior Federal Air Marshal designation during her tenure.

Ms. Metzger began her FAMS career as a FAM in the New York Field Office where she helped initiate the arrest procedures model for the FAMS, which was a direct result of her team's involvement in an international incident that took place on a flight during the 2004 Summer Olympics. Ms. Metzger also served a collateral duty in the Operations Section.

Ms. Metzger began her federal law enforcement career as a United States Immigration Inspector with the U.S. Immigration and Naturalization Service where she enforced Immigration and Nationality laws at John F. Kennedy International Airport.

Ms. Metzger holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in Forensic Psychology from City University of New York-John Jay College of Criminal Justice where she graduated Cum Laude. Ms. Metzger is currently a member of Psi Chi, the International Honor Society of Psychology.
