



WIFLE is pleased to offer a special Female Firearm's Training session at this years conference. This training includes 2 hours of classroom training and 4 hours of live fire. The classroom portion of the training is open to anyone who wants to participate. The Live Fire portion of the training will be open to the first 48 people who register. There will be a wait list available.

**WHAT TO BRING:** The **classroom** portion of the training will be held at The Westin La Paloma. Please bring and wear your holster, magazine pouch and cover (if required). **DO NOT BRING YOUR WEAPON OR AMMUNITION.** We will have instructors at the door using hand held metal detectors to ensure everyone's safety.

The **live fire training** will be held at the Pima Regional Training Center. Transportation will be provided. You will be contacted with a list of equipment necessary for live fire. However, we wanted to take this opportunity to advise that you will need to bring 300 rounds of ammunition.

### **EQUIPMENT CHECKLIST FOR LIVE FIRE TRAINING**

- Service Weapon
- Holster
- Magazine Pouch (at least 2 mag holders, if possible)
- Magazines (at least 2)
- 300 rounds of ammunition.
- Eye protection (ANZI approved) Sun glasses may be preferred since we are shooting outdoors.
- Hearing Protection (Hard Ears)
- Pants with belt loops on both the outer right and left side along the side seams of the pants leg. Low waisted pants work better for female shooters.
- Sturdy leather belt or a nylon tactical belt at least 1 ½ inches wide (Not a braided belt). Make sure that your belt will fit the slot in your magazine pouch and holster, as well as your pants. You should be able to cinch it tightly with all of your equipment on.
- Cover garment (if agency requires) without inside netting or pockets that might catch on your gun when you draw.
- Comfortable shoes without heels. Tennis shoes are fine.
- Rain coat.
- Ball Caps to keep ejected brass from falling on your face.
- Ballistic vest (If your agency requires you to wear in the field).
- Shirts that are fitted enough to stay tucked and out of your way during your draw process.
- Cleaning Kit if you want to clean your weapon following our training session.
