CBP is looking for Marine Interdiction Agents at the GL-9 level within the Office of Air and Marine. This position has an annual Base salary ranging from \$42,948.00 - \$55,413.00, with promotion potential to the GS-12 level. Locality and/or Cost of Living Allowance will be in addition to the Base salary once a location for selection, from the 31 listed locations in the announcement, has been determined.

MAJOR DUTIES

- > Performs marine law enforcement operations for the detection, prevention, interdiction and apprehension of terrorists, terrorist weapons, and other contraband and persons from illegally entering or attacking the United States.
- > Responsible for the safe operation of agency vessels used to interdict smuggling activities, while operating in a proactive defensive posture to safeguard specific potential targets within a maritime environment.
- > After attaining Vessel Commander Certification, is responsible for the following: overall command of the operation of vessels and crews; command and control interdiction tactics; and marine interdiction activities within CBP and with other law enforcement agencies.

KEY REQUIREMENTS Applicants must be U.S. Citizens, pass a background security investigation, pass a medical exam and drug test, have a valid state driver's license and have resided in the U.S. for at least the last three years. You must be under the age of 40 unless you claim veterans' preference or have previous federal civilian law enforcement experience.

Applicants must have an Operator of Uninspected Passenger Vessels (OUPV) license or a Master's license. You must have one year of specialized law enforcement experience or a master's degree in a qualifying field, such as law enforcement or criminal justice, or a combination of specialized experience and graduate education in a qualifying field.

If selected, you must be willing to travel at your own expense to San Diego, CA, for a written test, oral interview and vessel evaluation on a 30' twin engine intrepid.

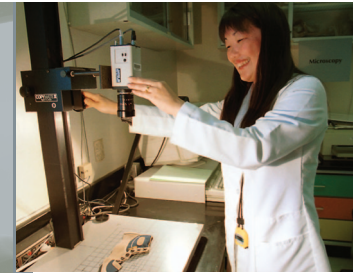
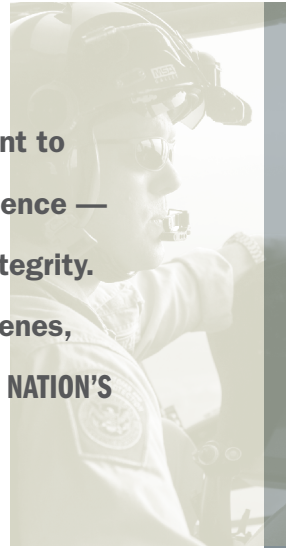
